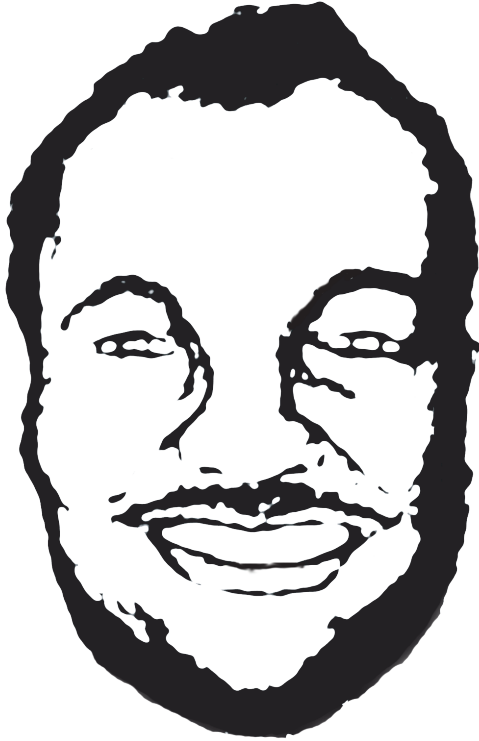


MEET ADEL HAMAD

Five years later, Adel Hamad is still a prisoner at Guantanamo.

A US Army Major describes Hamad's detention as "unconscionable."

His wife and children scrape by in Sudan in his absence.

It's time to send him home.
